Pray that we may fulfil our ministry

All through 1906 we have left you  
without news: not for want of things

"The Messenger" as you know, came

had thoughts of issuing an "occasional

a right to know.

So the solution that has come to

the contest as it sways to + fro.  
We could get this copied + sent  
round — say two month's story at a

time, to any who give their names  
as wishing for it, & who would under-  
take to forward it to the next on the  
list that accompanies it, without  
delay.

When its course is done, it would go back  
to my sister in Kilburn, who would  
keep it. From her, back numbers as they  
accumulate, could be obtained on loan,  
at any time by those whose leisure  
does not allow of their being on the  
above list, but who would now &  
then like to know how things are go-
