- Gene Daniels has had an article published in *Global Missiology* called 'Contextualizing Church-State Relations in Muslim Contexts' that looks at the missions situation in Central Asia. His focus is on Protestant churches started in recent decades by western missionaries. He argues that a common approach by mission churches of relating to governments by promoting western human right's interests is unhelpful as it "corroborates the misperception that *Protestant* faith is an intrinsically *foreign* faith to the peoples of central Asia" (p7). It would be better, says Gene (pseudonym) for missionaries to "demonstrate humility ... by ... publically ... not making any ... presumption to any kind of rights or privilege".
