frequenting the mission, and to the missionary, had not availed to stop the work.

The most important development at this time, when the crowds which normally came to me were held back by fear, was that individuals whose hearts had been touched by God's Word came to me secretly. Many of these only needed more individual teaching, which I gave them, to enable them to step over the line into Christian certainty. The ring of fear was eventually broken by the Jewish women who revolted against the behaviour of the rabbis and were resolved to return to the mission come what might. Two hundred and fifty thereafter assembled morning by morning for teaching and medical help.

The events of the past sixteen months had made them more serious and inclined them to listen attentively to the teaching, and this attitude of inquiry was marked also among the Moslem women. Slowly the converts returned; fifty members of the men's Bible Class also sat in their accustomed places, but I used greater discrimination in admitting men, requiring that they showed a genuine desire to be taught God's Word.

This peaceful ending to a time of trouble was in part due to a remarkable Divine intervention on my behalf. The chief opponent of the converts whom he hunted mercilessly, and the strongest ally of the fanatical element and of the rabbis, suddenly entered upon a most violent quarrel with the rabbis, the reason of which I never knew, and we were left in peace. These learned rabbis, who should have been my friends and helpers, have come clearly to see that God is blessing His own work in spite of the most violent persecution and opposition.

## The Task of the Christian Church

The population of the world is about 2,000,000,000 people. If it were reduced proportionately to 100 persons there would be 38 Christians, 19 Confucianists and Taoists, 12 Hindus, 11 Mohammedans, 10 Animists, 8 Buddhists, a Shintoist and a Jew.
