## THE PARTITION SCHEME FOR PALESTINE

Laws and Regulation; a Financial Adviser who also attends the Executive Council and prepares the Annual Estimates of Revenue and Expenditure; the Director of Lands and Survey under whose direction considerable progress has been made in survey, settlement of Title of Land, Partition of Musha (Village Common) land and the registration and administration of State Domain; and the Chief Curator of Antiquities whose Department has cleared and consolidated the magnificent ruins of Jerash, buttressed the great Mediæval citadel fortress of Kerak, and facilitated the visit of tourists to the 'Rose Red' ancient city of Petra.

The Department of Public Works, with an Arab Director of the Department, has been equally active. Many all-weather roads have been built, culverts and bridges constructed as also Customs sheds, Government Offices and an admirable water supply for Kerak, with an Engine House and a large concrete reservoir. Under the direction of an Arab Postmaster-General, postal facilities have been provided in the towns and larger villages, an excellent telegraph service has been developed connecting Trans-Jordan with the outer world and both local and trunk line telephones. Trans-Jordan is, of course, a member of the International Postal Union. are sixty-eight Government and one hundred and eightytwo non-Government schools, a Medical Department, a Government Bacteriologist, Veterinary services, rangers and other services.

## Palestine Troubles

The Jews, fleeing from trouble in Europe, took it with them to Palestine, and there it has increased exceedingly. So the Scriptures predicted. The children of Jacob and of Esau strive for the land, each for themselves. Religion vitiates all relationships in Palestine. Israel crucified its Lord and is unrepentant. Islam denies His death. Christianity, both Orthodox and Protestant, confesses in hundreds of daily services His Cross and Passion. These terrific religious antipathies cannot be matched in any other land.

Foreign mischief-makers with plentiful funds have cultivated trouble, and made it fruitful beyond public knowledge. Trouble is pushing 3,000,000 downtrodden European Jews toward Palestine. There is room in Palestine, Trans-Jordan and the Hauran for this number and more beside, if Arabs and Jews would cease from troubling trouble. It is an hour for watchfulness and prayer. God is

working not only in the shadows but in the light of noon-day.
