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THE CHRISTIAN APPROACH TO THE JEW

thrust humanity back into the lap of Odin and Thor, or into the lap of the ultra-modern god . . . the Machine . . . Economic Determinism . . . call it what you will . . . a rallying cry is necessary, and something more than the now grown colourless and indefinable Liberalism and Democracy, which, however, it might include. A human figure is necessary, a human figure with a maximum of humanness . . . the other extreme of the world offered to us by the Mussolinis, the Hitlers and the Stalins. Deep calleth unto deep, and those to whom it is given to see beyond the formal expression of doctrine to its underlying spiritual principles will find in this particular book and in the whole attitude of many enlightened Jews to Christianity to-day a challenge which is as important for the Jew as it is for the Christian.

The Evian Conference

The Evian Conference on the Refugee question, called at the invitation of the President of the United States, was opened on 6th July. Thirty-one nations were represented and the voluntary organization had unofficial observers present. Three representative Jews from Vienna were sent by the German authorities.

The League High Commissioner for Refugees from Germany stated that since 1933, 150,000 people had left Germany, and of these 120,000 had found asylum, leaving 30,000. The latter figure was more or less constant. Three conditions were generally necessary for successful emigration : land, training and money. Private organizations alone could not hope to handle the problem, but, as infiltration was more successful than mass migration, and much work with individuals would, therefore, be needed, the best policy was to extend official aid to voluntary efforts. According to the Jewish Colonization Organization, a maximum of £1,000 was needed to settle a family on land already available.

Various Governments stated their policy and, in general, there was an increased willingness among the potentially "receiving" countries to admit larger numbers than heretofore. Among the 300,000 Jews who have entered Palestine since 1920, there have been 40,000 German Jews. The United States is raising its immigrant quota to 20,000 from Germany and 7,000 from Austria. Argentina claimed that she had admitted 150 Jewish refugees for every 100 received in the United States of America.

The Conference decided to set up a Permanent Committee in London, adequately financed from official sources, in order to handle subsidies and take further action over the whole field. The preliminary meetings for this purpose were held in August.
