Christian Conference in Japan

The National Christian Council convened an All-Japan Christian Conference in Tokyo at the end of October, the general theme being 'The Christian Church's Contribution to the Nation's Development in the Present National Emergency.' Under this main heading four sub-subjects were studied and discussed: (1) Japanese Christianity and the Nation's Life: (2) Japanese Christianity and the Church's Life; (3) Japanese Christianity and Evangelism; (4) Japanese Christianity and International Relations.

The present national emergency has brought the Christian Church face to face with a new situation, presenting a mass of new problems. This situation and these problems compel the Church to re-study its policies and methods, especially in the fields of evangelism and co-operation.

The question of evangelism was one of the major concerns of the Conference. The present national emergency has not only brought a multitude of problems to the birth, but is presenting the Christian Church with unparalleled opportunities and challenging it to formulate a programme adequate for the hour and the need. There are indications that, in spite of the difficulties which the nation is facing, or possibly because of them, the time is ripening for aggressive co-operative evangelism on a nation-wide scale.
