No more was said then. The subject for the day was the fifteenth chapter of St. Matthew, and they read it verse by verse, slowly and attentively. Then they talked it over, each of the four incidents separately.

'The disciples were right . . . it was a *sheer impossibility* to find bread in the desert for four thousand men. Their own little stock of bread was laughably small, but Christ asked them to give it to Him, and they gave it. And *He made it enough*.' There was a pause. Before them all came the vision of that great wrong that must be righted, and of the tiny, absurd efforts which were all that they could muster against it. And yet . . .

'If all of us young people in the Young Men's Christian Association—if we joined together!' cried one of them. 'Would *you* join? And you? And you? We could give the little we have as the apostles did . . .'

*'Cause me to know the way wherein I should walk, for I lift up my soul unto Thee.'*

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### World Conference of Christian Youth

'The Victory of Jesus Christ' is to be the main subject of this Conference which is to be held in Amsterdam from 24th July to 2nd August. Fifteen hundred delegates will come from the youth movements in the different countries of the world where the Church exists. Not more than one-third may be over twenty-five, and all delegates must be appointed by their Churches or by national movements, unless they are co-opted. There will be some 150 speakers and leaders, and the Conference will consider the part that Christian youth has to play in regard to different aspects of the world mission of Christianity.

### A Rare Complaint

German-speaking Switzerland is afflicted by a rare complaint in these days, namely an excessive production of theological students. The following are the figures for the current term, with those for last year in brackets: Bale, 156 (120); Berne, 81 (68); Zurich, 115 (114). There is a total of 291 as against 240 in 1938, and the number of young ministers is higher than that of vacant parishes. In Germany the process has been the opposite, the number of theological students has dropped from 7,315 in 1932 to 1,850 in 1938.
