Government, nor are they used to wage war on China. To withhold gifts means that the missionaries starve, the workers suffer, and the work itself is held up. Consequently, the nation is pushed farther down the death road. What did we do during the Boxer Riots, when very many missionaries were martyred in China? Did we then cut China off from our prayers, sympathy and help? This seems to be what many of us are doing with Japan to-day, though no British citizen has suffered real loss of anything. Let us be consistent.

Let us be sympathetic with a comparatively young Church suffering from 'growing pains.' She must find out for herself how much spiritual deception there is in this specious 'Shrine' propaganda. God will force the issue when the time comes, so let us be prayerfully sympathetic, only asking that eyes may be opened and His Will obeyed.

Let us be more spiritual in our approach and attitude towards all such situations. If we studied the word of God as much as we study the daily Press, we should be more spiritual and less political. 'Our citizenship is in heaven.' The burden on the heart of God is the evangelization of the world and the preparation of the Church of Christ for His Coming; not the political destinies of godless nations as such. 'Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus.'

The Silver Coffin of Ghengis Khan

Messages from Chungking state that the remains of Ghengis Khan, which were removed from Inner Mongolia in June, in order to prevent them from being seized by the Japanese, are now lying in State in the ancient temple of Dragon Hill, thirty miles from Lanchow, where they are guarded by Mongol Lamas and soldiers who escorted the silver coffin to China.

Ghengis Khan is regarded in Europe as a military scourge and a destroyer of civilization, but his genius for war is still venerated in Mongolia. He was born in 1162 and died in 1227.
