from corner to corner and the interest in the Gospel demands at least a Sunday School.

The appalling sufferings of non-Arvan brethen in recent times constitute an urgent call to residents in the New World to collaborate with missionaries in every possible way to assist in refugee work. A business man can follow closely the constantly changing immigration regulations in the land of his adoption and, by prompt reports to the workers in Europe, may render timely service. Although infinitely more difficult, he may perhaps be successful, even if only once, in negotiating the elusive 'landing permit' without which the harried refugee's escape from Europe is often impossible. Unfortunately, with the present trend of immigration restriction, the doors in many countries appear to be fast closing or already closed. The question has been raised as to the attitude of Arvan believers, whose Governments are following anti-semitic policies, and it is a joy to know of individual instances where great sacrifices have been made to help refugees. Perhaps the most thrilling case I have yet encountered here is that of a physician who, with rare nobility of soul, has actually taken the extreme measure, when all other means of rescue failed, of legally adopting, among his own children, a Jewish boy of fourteen whom he had never seen. The father, who used to ridicule his friend's faith in their student days, has now turned to the Gospeller in his despair, and, while resigning himself to the inevitable as regards his own fate, has pleaded for the life of his only son. I am confident that World Dominion readers will join us in prayer that this boy, thus saved from starvation, may soon be won for Christ and live to be a faithful witness of the true Messiah.

Turkish Soldiers as Teachers

The Turkish Government cannot keep pace with the demand for education all over Turkey. Technical education is especially desired. Turkey is a land of villages, 40,000 of them all clamour for schools, but 32,000 have less than 400 inhabitants. The difficulty is being partly solved by giving soldiers, who have attained the rank of sergeant and have gained the primary certificate, the position of educators when they return to their villages after completing their military training. They are encouraged by a gift of a plot of land by the Government.
