THE MISSION TO THE JEWS

We must take the Jews as they are, that is, modern and as secularized as most educated Europeans. This presents a great difficulty: but it gives also great missionary opportunities.

Europe stands, if it is God's will, on the eve of an awakening. A prominent man, with excellent knowledge of the spiritual situation of Central Europe, wrote recently: 'There are two possibilities for Europe: chaos and anarchy, or a really new better and peaceful Europe, obedient to the Lord of Lords—to the Crucified and Risen.' This alternative is full of promise. The thinking men of our days feel that they are confronted with the decision, 'Christ or Nihilism.' Never since the days of the Apostles were the Jews faced with a decision for or against Christ, as at present. It is the task of the mission to the Jews to do all in its power to secure for the Jews their full share of the awakening which God is on the point of granting Europe. For this task we must pray and work.

Prayer of a Jewish Refugee Rabbi

'O Master of the World! All roads are closed against us. All strength has been taken away from us upon the earth. Our life has been ruined, and our security has been undermined. We no longer dare to contemplate the future of our people. In this hour of need, of persecution, of unrest and despondency, in this hour of humiliation and hopelessness, we turn to Thee, O Lord.

'Father of all mankind, of all creation, strengthen us . . . Place Thy healing fingers upon our beating hearts. Open our eyes, so that we may know, for we can find no hope, no consolation, among men. Let us be "holy unto Thee," for so we have once heard; the echo of these words rings in our ears as we wander through the centuries, firmly clinging to Thy words that Thou hast given us."—News Sheet on Christian Approach to the Jews.

At a recent meeting of the International Committee on the Christian Approach to the Jews, Dr. Hoffman stated that the Church was faced with a three-fold task:

- (I) That of good Samaritan service on behalf of the victims of persecution.
- (2) That of dealing with anti-Semitism and the cause of it.
- (3) That of Jewish evangelization, as such.
